## *Membership*

All parents and guardians of Kappa Deltas become eligible for membership on the day that their daughter accepts her bid, and remain eligible for the duration of their daughter's undergraduate education, assuming she remains affiliated with Kappa Delta. Parents are not required to be an initiated member of Kappa Delta or another Greek organization. No parent is required to be a member of a Kappa Delta Parents Club. Membership is strictly voluntary.
